Review of School Improvement Plan

Julie Barlow

Julie reviewed the goals that were selected last Spring. Goal #2 was re-worded at the district's request to include both staff and student as part of the SEL plan, which wasn't clear from the previous wording.

GOAL 1:

Maintain overall graduation rate of 96%, while increasing graduation rate of sub-groups: ELL 90.86% to 93%, Hispanic/Latino 93.65% to 95%, Economically Disadvantaged 88.54% to 92%, Students with Disabilities 77.19% to 80% in the next three years.

GOAL 2:

Improve student and staff relationships to improve school climate and build a sense of community and safety by implementing Social Emotional Learning (SEL) strategies as measured by SEL Walkthrough Tool and DSD School Climate Surveys.

GOAL 3:

Increase student ability in critical thinking and problem-solving school wide to increase academic success.

Additionally, the school enrollment makes the school eligible for another 5.9 secretary. We have decided to hire the new secretary with the expectation that the person will also be over testing in the counseling area (ACT, NMSQT, Utah RISE, etc.) and the funding of \$10,000 previously approved by the Community Council would revert back to Trustlands to be used elsewhere, pending project approval by the Council.

Budget Review
