Layton High School Frequently Asked Legion Award Questions

Can I receive more than one medal?

No. Each student can apply for and receive one medal. This medal reflects your specialization in one particular Legion and Pathway.

Can I receive a Legion award if I have one or more U's?

No. Just as in graduation, all U's must be cleared for you to receive a Legion award.

Do I need to have a certain GPA to receive a Legion Award?

No. There is no GPA requirement in receiving a Legion award. You just have to be eligible to graduate and you need to have passed all the classes you use to fulfill the award requirements.

When I am filling out the Legion Award Application – and it asks me to list what I have done for a Major – am I listing the classes I have taken or the credits I have completed?

You list credits you have or will complete. Each Major award requires six credits which can be fulfilled by year or semester classes. Each semester class counts as one-half credit and a year long class counts as one credit. Classes from 9th to 12th grade may be used.

Can I use classes outside of my Legion on my Award Application?

No – sort of. Each award is directly related to classes you have taken within your chosen Legion. In fact, the awards are meant to show your concentration of effort within a specific Legion Pathway. Each Legion has three or more Pathways and each Pathway has a Focus One level (a very narrow set of classes), a Focus Two level (a slightly broader set of classes. Two of your six credits must come from Focus One classes.

Can I use classes from any Legion pathway on the Application?

No. All the credits listed must come from the same pathway.

Can I count (towards the credits I need for my award) classes that I am taking now or will take next semester?

Yes. In fact the classes you take your Senior year are the ones that fit best in the Legion Pathways.

Can I change Legions once I have chosen?

Yes. You can change Legions once a year. If you see that a lot of your classes fall naturally in another Legion then you should probably switch.
