

What is the Certificate of Completion (COC)?

The **Certificate of Completion (COC)** is awarded when students complete all core and breadth requirements with a 'C' or better and a minimum 2.0 GPA. No more than 20 CE credits can be taken per semester and no more than 30 CE credits per school year. Once applied for and awarded, the COC will appear on the student's official college transcripts making these Gen Ed credits transferable between public institutions within the Utah System of Higher Education. General Education credits account for the 36 - 40 credit hours needed towards the approximately 60 credit hour Associates degree. ***Do not be misadvised.
