Scholarship Checklist:

- Fill out and track your qualifications with the scholarship resume attached. List academic awards, community service, leadership experience, and extra-curricular activities.
- Get and stay organized. Keep track of all the scholarships you apply for.
- Figure out which types of scholarships you are interested in. Academic, Leadership, Community Service, Athletic, Music, etc... 90% of all scholarships come from Universities and Colleges. Try to apply for admission and scholarships for at least three schools.
- Fill out the FAFSA. Starting Oct. 1 of your senior year. It is the only way to apply for all federal and most states' financial aid. Many scholarships will require you fill this out.
- Use scholarship search engines and create profiles to narrow your search. Google is a great way to narrow your search for scholarships. Just a reminder... NEVER give out your SSN, if they need it they will have access to FAFSA.
- Become familiar with other types of financial aid; grants, work study jobs on campus, student loans, and employer reimbursement programs.

- Get and stay organized. Keep track of all the scholarships you apply for.
- **APPLY**!! Don't get discouraged by rejection. Keep applying, the more you apply the higher your chances of receiving a scholarship
